Park Manager Time

The park staff is getting ready for the Fall Festival. The grounds have been mowed. Parking will be \$10. The park is using the honor parking system during the week days. The campground is sold out for the weekend. Currently the Hickory Ridge Campground has ½ tank of water and this continues to be monitored. Due to no rain, the festival parking should not be a problem. Three ponies have been getting out of their designated area recently. Merchandise for resale is at \$105,970 which is \$2,000 more than last this time last year.

New Business

- Rhonda shared that Gerald Anderson's brother recently passed. FOGH will send a sympathy card.
- Hunt dates are November 7 & 8 for muzzle loader and November 21 & 22 for firearms. Rhonda will make ham biscuits this year. FOGH will reimburse the cost of the purchase of food.
